**SCHEDULE YP-9 (UNBUNDLED)
POST LIGHT SERVICE
100-WATT**

AVAILABILITY

Available to all member/customers of the Shenandoah Valley Electric Cooperative for the purpose of providing rural homes, schools, churches, camps, businesses, etc. All fixtures will be Mercury-Vapor or Sodium-Vapor, equipped with a photoelectric cell to provide dusk-to-dawn service and will be connected ahead of the meter.

SERVICE AGREEMENT

- A. Upon application, the Cooperative will install and maintain an outside post light on the premises of the member/customer. The member/customer must agree to keep the light for at least 24 months.
- B. The member/customer shall notify the Cooperative when fixture fails to operate. Fixture will be serviced within 48 hours of such notification under normal conditions.
- C. The member/customer will be billed for the yard light each billing period and such charges added to the regular electric bill at the following rates:

ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE

Each kilowatt hour is subject to adjustment for changes in Wholesale Power Costs as per the Cooperative's Wholesale Power Cost Adjustment Clause, Schedule WPA.

SCHEDULE YP-9 (UNBUNDLED)

INSTALLATION AGREEMENT

- A. The post light will be installed within a maximum of 100' from the Cooperative's existing underground facilities where 120-volt service is available. Owner must provide trenching and back filling under the supervision of the Cooperative. Trench shall be 24" minimum depth.
- B. Owner must provide at no cost to the Cooperative the necessary right of way for the underground facilities; make the strip into which the underground facilities are to be located accessible to the Cooperative's equipment; remove all obstructions from the strip; grade the strip to within 4: of final grade; and provide continuing access to the Cooperative for operation, maintenance, or replacement of the facilities. Shrub, trees, and grass requiring protection from the Cooperative's equipment during installation and maintenance of underground facilities will be the responsibility of the property owner who will reseed the trench cover where required.
- C. If additional facilities are required for installation of the light or lights, the Cooperative will provide and install these at no cost to the member/customer, provided the cost of the above-described facilities does not exceed four (4) times the anticipated, continuing annual revenue of each fixture as per its monthly rate.

The Cooperative reserves the right to require all costs in excess of the 4-to-1 ratio be paid prior to construction. An estimated cost, provided by SVEC, would be made under these conditions.

The facilities will remain the property of, and will be maintained and replaced as becomes necessary by the Cooperative.
